FINANCE

The Finance Committee met and reviewed the 2024 EOY financials (Budget and Investment Accounts) and discussed 2025 Budget and Investments YTD (first 2 ½ months), and the Executive Committee did the same.

Below is the cumulative return for 2024. The investment objective is moderate growth and currently the entire portfolio is weighted about 79% stocks, 21% bonds & cash.

We have been busy hiring staff over the past few months. Marissa Nieddu joined us in January as the new Marketing and Communications Specialist. We have hired four Summer Naturalists - one returning from last year and three are students from the IE program. We have also hired a

second Education Specialist, Madeleine Wikstrom, who will be starting in late April. She and Julie will jointly run the Nature Center, take care of our Animal Ambassadors, run programs throughout the year and provide Outreach opportunities during the school year. The rehiring of this position will also allow us to focus on adult and youth volunteering and programming.
