JOIN HIGHLANDS BIOLOGICAL STATION ON A JOURNEY TO VIEW THE TOTAL SOLAR ECLIPSE ON AUGUST 12, 2026, IN SPAIN.

Every total solar eclipse is spectacular, but the view from Palma de Mallorca will be extra special. When the Moon's shadow races across Spain, the eclipsed Sun will be floating just a few degrees above the western horizon. The interplay of celestial geometry will create dramatic effects in the atmosphere that don't happen when totality is high overhead.

Our journey begins on August 7 with an overnight flight from the U.S. to the vibrant city of Barcelona, Spain. Upon arrival, we'll settle into the luxurious Le Méridien Barcelona Hotel and explore the heart of Barcelona's Gothic Quarter, its historic streets, and hidden gems. Our first evening will culminate in a delightful *tapas* welcome dinner.

Over the next two days, we'll immerse ourselves in Barcelona's rich culture and architectural wonders, from Antonio Gaudí's iconic masterpieces like Casa Batlló and La Pedrera to the awe-inspiring La Sagrada Familia and the enchanting Parque Güell. On a special visit, we'll dine under the stars at the Fabra Observatory and observe the night skies of Barcelona through a large vintage telescope. Enjoy a free day to explore Barcelona's many treasures at your own pace.

On August 11, we fly to the idyllic island of Mallorca. The next day, we'll visit the charming village of Valldemossa, nestled in the breathtaking Tramuntana mountains. As evening falls, we'll set sail from Port de Sóller, ready to witness the awe-inspiring total solar eclipse from the deck of our cruise ship. Experience the magic of totality as the Sun sets, casting an otherworldly glow over the sea. The following day, enjoy leisure time in Palma de Mallorca.

Finally, on August 14, we'll return to the U.S., returning cherished memories of this once-in-a-lifetime adventure. Join us on this captivating journey and be part of an extraordinary celestial event! A pre-tour to Madrid, Toledo, and Sergovia is offered for those wishing to extend their time in Spain.









STUDY LEADER

Dr. James (Jim) Costa, Executive Director and Professor, Highlands Biological Station of Western Carolina University

Your study leader is Dr. James (Jim) Costa, Executive Director and Professor at Western Carolina University's Highlands Biological Station. Jim is a field naturalist who teaches evolutionary biology, biogeography, and travel field courses in mainland Ecuador and the Galápagos Islands. With a special interest in the history of science, Jim has written extensively on the explorer-naturalists Charles Darwin and Alfred Russel Wallace, co-discoverers of evolution by natural selection. Recipient of the Wallace Medal and the Stephen Jay Gould Prize, his most recent books include *Radical by Nature: The Revolutionary Life of Alfred Russel Wallace* (Princeton, 2023), *Darwin and the Art of Botany* (with Bobbi Angell; Timber, 2023,), *and The Descent of Man: An Annotated*

Edition of Darwin's Classic Work (with Elizabeth Yale; forthcoming from Princeton in 2026). Jim is a long-time Research Associate of Harvard's Museum of Comparative Zoology, and has served as study leader/lecturer for the Harvard Alumni Association Travel Program for many years.

ITINERARY

Friday, August 7: U.S. / Barcelona

Depart from your home city overnight to Barcelona, Spain. (MEALS ALOFT)

Saturday, August 8: Arrive in Barcelona

We will arrive in Barcelona and transfer from the airport to our hotel. After check-in and some rest, we will gather for a walking tour of Barcelona's Gothic Quarter, exploring historic streets, squares, hidden corners, and century-old buildings. In the evening, we will enjoy a tapas welcome dinner. LE MÉRIDIEN BARCELONA HOTEL (D)

Sunday, August 9: Barcelona

After breakfast, we'll set off on a morning tour along the elegant Paseo de Gracia, where we'll marvel at the iconic works of the renowned architect Antonio Gaudí, including Casa Batlló and La Pedrera (Casa Milá). Following a delightful group lunch, we'll explore La Sagrada Familia, Barcelona's breathtaking cathedral, and the enchanting Park Güell, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. We'll dine under the stars at the Fabra Observatory in Barcelona tonight. After dinner, we'll step into the observatory's grand dome, where the early 20th-century modernist hall and the historic 1904 meridian telescope—one of Europe's largest and oldest—await to reveal the wonders of the night sky. Monday, August 10: Barcelona

Tuesday, August 11:

Barcelona / Palma de Mallorca

After breakfast, we will fly to Mallorca, the largest island in the Balearic Islands, part of Spain. The island features an array of landscapes, from the rugged Serra de Tramuntana mountain range to the serene plains of Es Pla and the picturesque coves and beaches that dot the coastline. On arrival we'll tour Palma de Mallorca, including a visit to the Cathedral of Santa Maria of Palma (La Seu), renowned for its magnificent architecture and rose window, which includes a combination of Gothic, Renaissance, and Baroque elements, making it a masterpiece of historical artistry. Wednesday, August 12: Palma de Mallorca / Valldemossa / Port de Sóller (eclipse day)

This morning we'll depart for Valldemossa, a village steeped in old-world charm, nestled in an idyllic valley amid the Tramuntana mountains. Its ancient blonde stone houses contrast vividly with the surrounding green forests of olive, oak, and almond trees, and the blue sky above. In the early evening, we'll embark on the cruise from the Port de Sóller. Aboard our vessel just before sunset, we'll experience the total solar eclipse. Totality lasts 94 seconds, centered on 8:31:32 p.m. with the Sun 2.5° high.

Sunset (8:50 p.m.) occurs with a partial eclipse still in progress. We will partake in a celebratory eclipse group dinner thereafter. VICTORIA GRAN MELIÁ HOTEL (B, L, D)

Thursday, August 13: Palma de Mallorca

After breakfast, we will transfer to Palma de Mallorca airport for connecting flights home to the U.S. (B)



PRE-TOUR EXTENSION

August 3-8: Madrid, Toledo, Ávila, Segovia

Experience the best of Madrid and its surrounding cities of Toledo and Segovia with our Pre-Tour extension. Your journey begins with an arrival transfer in Madrid, followed by a half-day tour that includes the city's iconic landmarks such as Puerta del Sol, Plaza Mayor, and the Royal Palace. Step back in time with a full-day excursion to enchanting Toledo, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Next, we tour Avila, a city known for its medieval walls, cobblestone streets, churches, and cuisine. We'll also explore Segovia, famed for its Roman aqueduct and fairy-tale Alcázar. At the end of our pre-tour, we will take a high-speed train to Barcelona to begin the main tour.

Our base for exploration in Madrid will be the five-star Wellington Hotel Madrid (4 nights), an emblem of luxury and elegance. WHAT TO EXPECT

This exclusive Total Solar Eclipse Tour to Spain is designed for HBS members and their friends who are also interested in observing a total solar eclipse and exploring the food, history and culture of Spain. In Madrid, expect temperatures ranging from 70°F (21°C) to 90°F (32°C); Barcelona typically has temperatures of 72°F (22°C) and 86°F (30°C) and Mallorca's average August temperatures are 75°F (24°C) to 88°F (31°C). Travel is by private coach, boat, and plane, with a high-speed train on the Pre-Tour extension. This tour will be a shared departure with the California Academy of Sciences. Please also note the Fabra Observatory and the eclipse viewing vessel will be shared by other educational affinity groups. However, your joint departure with the California Academy of Sciences will have its own tour director, buses and lecture space. As this is an astronomical event of international interest, hotels may be full of other eclipse travelers and independent travel groups from around the globe.

Since some travel in Mallorca will be relatively remote, everyone must be flexible with time schedules and willing to explore spectacular natural areas and small towns. Program participants requiring extraordinary assistance must be accompanied by someone who can and will provide all required assistance. To help you choose the trip best suited for you and to ensure the smooth and efficient operation of our tour, we describe this trip as moderately active.

PROGRAM NOTE

Totality on August 12, 2026, will be relatively brief all across Spain, and from Port de Sóller on Mallorca, it will last 1m34s. The partial eclipse begins at 7:38 p.m. local time (Sun 12° high). Mid-eclipse follows at 8:31:32 p.m. with the Sun 2.5° above the western horizon. We will provide an optimal viewing location aboard a catamaran boat in Mallorca to experience this phenomenon. Please keep in mind that because viewing the total solar eclipse will be weather-dependent, there is always a chance that passengers will not be able to view it or view it only for a short time. Neither Royal Adventures nor the HBS guarantees the viewing of the total solar eclipse. Keep in mind that unexpected schedule changes could affect the program. Your Tour Director will keep you informed of any planned activities changes. A sense of humor, flexibility, and patience will be greatly appreciated during this program, especially on Eclipse Day.
